	NEW Using Behavior Data to Support Grade Level Problem Solving <i>Effective grade level problem solving of behavior allows classroom teachers to first address common behavioral issues at a universal level. Implementing good instructional and behavioral classroom-level interventions for specific behavioral issues may reduce the need for more intensive, individualized plans, reserving resources for those students who truly require a more intense level of support. This interactive session equips participants to run an effective grade level team meeting using behavior data resulting in a specific action plan to address precise problem statements based on the data. Participants will deepen their understanding of behavior science, analyze behavioral data, and apply a framework of prevention, teaching, and responding to develop grade level - classroom level plans for addressing behavior.</i>	Hudson A
